REDUCED BURDEN FOR GRANTEES



The AMS 2.0 has been redesigned to reduce the burden monitoring places on grantees through more effective monitoring and by making efficient use of available resources.

AMS 2.0 also takes advantage of changes initiated by the HSPPS to focus on the grantee's ability to demonstrate progress over time.
